THIS PROSPECTUS is published to give preliminary information about the Tours listed below to all concerned, and to invite applications. It is important that it should be read by CANDIDATES AND THEIR PARENTS, so that they can be fully aware of the requirements. Further copies may be obtained from the General Secretary of the Council for Cadet Rifle Shooting (CCRS).

Please note that, if you apply for any of the Tours listed below, you and your parents need to be aware that you MUST be available for Ex Maple Taste, 22 -25 March 2012, barring unavoidable scholastic commitments. If you fail to attend that training, you risk forfeiting your place on the Tour(s) concerned.

The Application Form only needs to be completed once and the Tours applied for identified at the start of the form.

Wherever the word Master appears it is used as a generic term covering individuals of either gender.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS

1. a. In addition to the eligibility criteria listed for each Tour, every applicant must be recommended by his school or unit as an individual who will prove a worthy ambassador of his country, and who is fitted to be a member of a British Cadet / Junior Team. The Tours to Canada and the Channel Islands are officially sponsored and grant-aided by the Ministry of Defence, and the Tour to South Africa is a Great Britain Team. The Commandant and Adjutant of each Tour must be able to rely implicitly upon the highest standards of conduct, discipline and individual responsibility throughout the Tour and during the preparations for it.

b. The importance of these qualities in maintaining the reputation of the British Cadet movement and the School / Unit in the UK and overseas cannot be too strongly emphasised. For this reason the Council requires each application to be supported by a character reference from the candidate's Housemaster (CCF candidates) or Commanding Officer (SCC/ACF/ATC) or Club Captain (non-cadet applicants for the Tour to South Africa) which is endorsed personally by the Headmaster, or by the County Commandant or equivalent or the Club Chairman (see "Guidelines", para 2). Applications not having this second independent character reference supplied by a person other than the signatory at para 3 of the "Application Form - Part II" will not be considered.

FINANCE

2. a. For each Tour, team funds will pay for fares, transport, entry fees, ammunition, butt markers, feeding, accommodation, the cost of the Team tie, blazer badge and other items which are worn as part of the official team uniform, presentation items and visits. They will not cover individual spending, therefore members will require their own pocket money.

b. It is realised that the high cost may deter some suitable applicants. Experience has shown, however, that assistance can be found for a candidate who is worthy of selection but whose parents are unable to afford the full amount. The school, cadet headquarters or club may be in a position to help, and CCRS itself has some funds for this purpose. In such cases the application for the team should be submitted and, if successful, an approach should be made in confidence through the General Secretary, CCRS to the Hon. Organiser of the Tour concerned for advice.

RIFLES

3. Each member of every Tour must have the exclusive use of one high quality target rifle, and any applicant who possesses such a rifle will be able to take it, provided it is of suitable quality and in good condition. CCRS holds a stock of target rifles, and any successful applicant who wishes to borrow one of these will be allotted a rifle for his or her exclusive use from the date of the training weekend, in October for GB U19 and Exercise Maple Taste in March for the others, until the return from the relevant Tour, or with negotiation, the end of the season.

NOMINATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURE

4. a. For Cadet applicants, Officers and Masters I/C Shooting are asked to submit names and full details of candidates on the Application Form downloadable from the website. Part 1 is to be completed by the candidate and Part II by the Officer or Master I/C Shooting. The Cadet Training Record must be completed for all candidates for the BCRT and UKCRT. A character recommendation on official headed paper must be attached. Full instructions are given on the form itself, and in the "Guidelines" at Annex A to this Prospectus. In the interests of the candidate, the greatest care and accuracy should be taken in the completion of each application in all respects.

b. All non-cadet applicants for South Africa should contact the General Secretary CCRS as soon as possible.

- c. Further information may be obtained from the **General Secretary CCRS, Derby Lodge, Bisley Camp, Brookwood, WOKING, Surrey GU24 0NY, e-mail simon@taraccrs.co.uk**, to whom the completed Application Form must be returned by no later than the date specified for the earliest of the Tours applied for.
- d. Successful candidates will be notified immediately after the meeting of the Selection Committee for each Tour.

UK CADET TEAM MATCHES AT BISLEY

5. Attention is drawn to the following matches, for which representative British Cadet teams will be selected from those taking part in the NRA Imperial Meeting:
- a. The match for the Alexander Graham Bell Cup. This is the "home" fixture against the Royal Canadian Army Cadets National Rifle Team (RCACNRT); Cadet/Junior Teams from Overseas may also compete. It is fired between teams of 12 on the Second Thursday of the NRA Imperial Meeting.
 - b. The Inter Services Short and Long Range matches. Since 1973 British and Canadian Cadet Force teams of 12 have competed against teams from the Regular and Reserve forces in these matches, and have held their own with considerable success. Teams from other overseas Cadet Forces and South Africa also now compete. The matches are fired on the Second Tuesday.
 - c. The Cadet International, fired on the First Friday, the day after the Ashburton, now provides an extra match for the overseas teams. In 2012 the RCACNRT are currently expected.
6. The Commandant of UK Cadet Teams at Bisley for 2012 will in due course select the teams, and all serving cadets competing in the main NRA Imperial Meeting are eligible. They must enter all their scores on the sheets posted on the Derby Lodge notice board, as selection is done on the basis of those scores. Last year about 200 cadets remained at Bisley to fire in the target rifle events of the second week, and CCRS is very willing to give advice and assistance to others, or to their units or schools, who would like to compete in the Imperial Meeting.

TRAINING

7. The squad for the GB U19 will have a training / selection weekend on the weekend 20 - 23 October 2011. Successful applicants for the BCRT will be required for team training at Bisley on Exercise Maple Taste, 22 - 25 March 2012 and the squad for the UKCRT will attend the same exercise after which that team will be confirmed. Costs apart from travel are covered from team funds.

GREAT BRITAIN UNDER 19 RIFLE TEAM SOUTH AFRICA TOUR 2012

AIM

8. As part of the exchange programme with South Africa, the National Rifle Association (NRA) is planning to send a representative Great Britain Under 19 Rifle Team (GB U 19), of three Officers and 8 shooters, to South Africa. They will take part in the South African Bisley Union's (SABU) 'Bisley' Meetings on the General de Wet Ranges at Bloemfontein, in April 2012. During this Meeting the team will compete against the South African Junior Rifle Team in two Under 19 International Matches. The NRA has delegated the management and organisation of the team to CCRS.

OUTLINE PLAN

9. The Officers who will be taking the team are:

10. The provisional dates are 15 Mar – 8 April. During the Tour the team will be the guests of SABU which will provide some of the transport and accommodation. The Tour will include:

- a. Up to 11 days concentrated shooting, mostly uncoached, in the SA Championships.
- b. 13 days conducted and self led tours within South Africa, which may include trips to Potchefstroom staying on a game farm, Mpumalanga, a nature reserve, a canopy tour, white water rafting, and the Kruger National Park. Full plans are yet to be confirmed.

11. In addition, all members of the team are required to attend at Bisley for a squad training weekend 20 – 23 October 2011.

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY

12. Candidates for the GB U19 Team must:

- a. Be under 19 on 22 March 2012 and at least 16 on that date. Other things being equal, the older candidate within this range will be preferred.
- b. Be qualified to shoot for Great Britain plus the Channel Islands and be the holder of a British passport.
- c. Unless the circumstances are exceptional, have had the experience of competition shooting in the Grand Aggregate events of at least one NRA Imperial Meeting, or produce evidence of equivalent experience.

13. Although most applications will come from members of the cadet organisations, **any shooter meeting the requirements of age and nationality is eligible.**

FINANCE

14. The overall cost of the Tour is yet to be confirmed but is likely to be about £25000, so the basic contribution required from each member will be £995 and, once selected, members will be required to raise as much additional sponsorship as they can.

15. Members will additionally require pocket money in South Africa. Experience indicates that about £150 should be allowed for this.

BRITISH CADET RIFLE TEAM [THE ATHELINGS] CANADIAN TOUR 2012

AIM

17. As part of the annual cadet exchange programme with Canada, CCRS is planning to send a representative British Team of 3 Officers and 18 Cadets (The Athelings) from the CCF, SCC, ACF and ATC to take part in the Cadet Full-bore Competitions and the Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association (DCRA) at the Connaught Ranges, Ottawa, in August 2012. During the DCRA Meeting a team of 12 Athelings will compete against a team of Royal Canadian Army Cadets for the Michael Faraday Cup.

OUTLINE PLAN

18. The following Officers have accepted the invitation of the Council to be:

19. The provisional dates are 2 - 30 August. The Tour will include:

- a. 15 days concentrated uncoached shooting in the Cadet and DCRA Meetings.
- b. A total of 12 days conducted tour of Ontario and Quebec, including hopefully a 2+ day canoeing and camping expedition. During this time the team will be the guests of the Canadian Defence Department which will meet the costs of accommodation, rations and transport.

20. In addition, all members of the team are required to attend:

- a. At Bisley for Exercise Maple Taste (see para 7).
- b. At Bisley to compete in the NRA Imperial Meeting, 13 - 21 July tbc.

NB: 1. There are several practice matches at weekends during the summer which Athelings are encouraged to attend if possible.

NB: 2. During the Schools Meeting, Schools are required to release their Athelings 0800-1000 on First Wednesday to take part in the Rex Goddard Stage 1, the match against the Canadian Cadets shot with the Host Countries' issued weapons. Stage 2 is shot in Canada. Athelings from Units of the SCC/ACF/ATC are expected to take part.

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY

21. Candidates for the British Cadet Rifle Team must:

- a. Be under 19 on 1 September 2012 and preferably over 17 on that date. Other things being equal, the older candidate within this range will be preferred;
- b. Be the holder of a British passport;
- c. 1) If a CCF cadet, be eligible to compete in the 2012 Ashburton Match. (One who leaves school before the Summer Term is thus not eligible.)
2) If a cadet in SCC/ACF/ATC, be grant earning on 31 July 2012;
- d. Unless the circumstances are exceptional, have had when nominated at least 2 years' experience either in the Ashburton team or in the Inter-Services Cadet Rifle Meeting.

NB. Experience of competition shooting in the Grand Aggregate events of at least one NRA Imperial Meeting is virtually a requirement for selection for a CCF candidate - otherwise, evidence of equivalent experience must be produced. Cadets from SCC/ACF/ATC without such experience are assessed at a preliminary selection week-end 9 - 11 September 2011 (details of which were circulated after the 2011 ISCRM). Selection takes place in December.

FINANCE

22. The overall cost of the tour now exceeds £1500 per head. For many years the Ministry of Defence has historically made a grant to the team, and provided that this continues in 2012, the contribution required from each cadet should not exceed £700 (tbc).

23. Cadets will additionally require pocket money in Canada. Experience indicates that about £150 should be allowed for this.

APPLICATION FORM

24. The Application Form must be returned to the General Secretary CCRS, Derby Lodge, Bisley Camp, Brookwood, WOKING, Surrey GU24 0NY, by no later than **Monday 31st October 2011**. Applications received after this date may not be considered.

UNSUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

25. Candidates wishing to be considered for the United Kingdom Cadet Rifle Team to the Channel Islands Tour 2012 (see paras 26 - 34) if they are not selected for Canada must put a ✓ in the relevant box at the top of the Application Form - Part 1.

UNITED KINGDOM CADET RIFLE TEAM to the CHANNEL ISLANDS JERSEY TOUR 2012 ~ Ex ISLAND CREAM

AIM

26. As part of the cadet representative shooting programme, CCRS is sending 12 cadets as the United Kingdom Cadet Rifle Team to the Channel Islands (UKCRT), where they will compete in the Jersey Rifle Championships and shoot a match against a Channel Islands Under 19 Team.

OUTLINE PLAN

27. The following Officers have accepted the invitation of CCRS to be:

28. The dates are Friday 17 to Monday 27 August 2012. The proposed itinerary will include:

- a. two days of sightseeing
- b. five days of shooting.

29. The Team and reserves should shoot the NRA Imperial Meeting in 2012 [13 - 21 Jul tbc].

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY

30. Candidates for the UK CRT CI must:

- a. Be under 18 and not less than 16 years old on 1 September 2012;
- b. Be a bona-fide member of the CCF, SCC, ACF or ATC, and eligible to shoot in either the Ashburton or the Inter Services Cadet Rifle Meeting in July 2012.
- c. Ideally, have had the experience of competition shooting in the Grand Aggregate events of at least one NRA Imperial Meeting.

31. Candidates do not need to be the holders of a British passport.

FINANCE

32. The overall cost of the Tour is over £750 per head, but the Ministry of Defence usually makes a grant to the Tour, so that the contribution required from each cadet should not exceed £375 (tbc). Should the trip result in a significant under-spend, an appropriate refund will be made.

33. The above figure does not cover individual spending, and therefore members will require their own pocket money.

APPLICATION FORM

34. The Application Form must be returned to the General Secretary CCRS, Derby Lodge, Bisley Camp, Brookwood, WOKING, Surrey GU24 0NY, by no later than **Monday 5th December 2011**. Applications received after this date may not be considered.

SELECTION

35. A squad to attend Ex Maple Taste, 22 – 25 Mar 2012, for training and final assessment will be selected shortly after Christmas from all those who apply. Immediately after the Exercise the team will be confirmed.

GUIDELINES

1. The Application Form Part I is to be completed by the Candidate, and counter-signed by his/her Officer or Master I/C Shooting or Club Captain. It must be accompanied by two separate recommendations and, for candidates for the BCRT and UKCRT, the Cadet's Training Record Form, as described below.

2. CHARACTER REPORT A recommendation as to character and suitability for membership of a British Cadet /Junior GB team, as indicated at para 1 of the Candidate Requirements. This should be written on the official headed paper of the School, Unit or Club, as follows:

a. For CCF candidates. By the Housemaster, and endorsed, with further comment if desired, by the Headmaster.

b. For SCC, ACF & ATC candidates. By the Company Commander (or equivalent), and endorsed, with further comment if desired, by the County Commandant (or equivalent).

c. For non cadet applicants for the Tour to South Africa. By the Club Chairman.

3. SHOOTING REPORT This is to be submitted on the attached Application Form Part II. The Selectors realise that the bulk of the work of compiling and checking an application falls on you, the Officer or Master I/C Shooting or Club Captain, and these notes are intended to help in presenting your candidate(s) as effectively as possible. Of necessity, the Selectors rely greatly on your detailed reports and assessments of skill.

a. General. The headings and guidelines are not exhaustive. The Selectors welcome all relevant comment, both laudatory and adverse, which will create a comprehensive basis for selection.

b. The Candidate's Application Form (Part I). Full and accurate scores are essential; please check the form in detail before forwarding it. If an **Aggregate is incomplete**, give as full an explanation as possible.

c. Anomalous Individual Scores. Explanation of any anomalous individual scores is most important, and of great help to the Selectors. Again, it should be as full as possible.

d. Practice Shoots. In addition to the scores on the candidate's application, any information you may have about practice shoots will be helpful.

e. Personal Assessment. Your personal assessment of a candidate is very important, and should be as specific as possible.

f. Team Experience. Your personal assessment of a candidate's performance in a team environment and ability to command respect is highly relevant and required.

Note: Many candidates show performance "dips" from one year to another: it is particularly important for such apparent anomalies to be explained. Your shooting report should contain specific and detailed comment in such cases.

4. CADET'S TRAINING RECORD Over the years there have been queries raised, primarily by the Canadians, as to the bona fide status of certain Athelings. It has become necessary for us to be able to demonstrate that team members truly fit the required criteria and consequently, for ALL candidates for the BCRT and the UKCRT, you must please ensure that the appropriate Officer completes and signs the Cadet's Training Record Form attached to this prospectus.
